MIDLAND CITY COUNCIL MINUTES January 22, 2019

BRIEFING SESSION

The City Council convened in a Briefing Session in the basement conference room, City Hall, Midland, Texas, at 9:30 a.m. on January 22, 2019.

Council Members present: Mayor Jerry F. Morales, Mayor Pro Tem John B. Love III (District

2), Council Member Spencer Robnett (At-Large), Council Member Michael Trost (At-Large), Council Member Scott Dufford (District 1), Council Member Sharla Hotchkiss (District 3), and Council

Member J.Ross Lacy (District 4).

Staff members present: City Manager Courtney Sharp, City Attorney John Ohnemiller,

Mayor Morales called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

1. Receive a presentation regarding affordable housing needs and possible solutions.

Development Services Director Chuck Harrington reported there have been several groups working to find opportunities for people to reside in Midland at reasonable rates. He noted that affordable housing means different things to different groups and in Midland can range from \$140,000 to \$190,000. Some of the problem is a shortage of affordable builders.

Community Development Manager Isaac Garnett explained incentives currently used by Midland including up to \$14,000 in down payment assistance for those who qualify in the low to moderate income bracket.

Mr. Harrington reviewed the current incentive program noting builders can receive up to \$4,500 per house and reimbursement is based on having to make public improvements and they must build and sell four houses prior to reimbursement.

Mr. Garnett noted that a lot of the properties in the City that are buildable are tied up. The City should continue to build streets to make it palatable and affordable. Lots go for \$30,000 to \$35,000 per lot.

Mr. Harrington noted that \$4,500 doesn't make a significant incentive. The builders have asked for \$9,000. Another option is to allow incentive reimbursement after the first house is sold instead of waiting for the fourth, or to eliminate the need to have public improvements.

Building Official Steve Thorpe reported that for a house valued at \$126,000 the permit fee is \$418 and the tree improvement fee is \$252. A typical new home takes 21-23 inspections, but it could be done in 13-14 if items are completed correctly the first time. Another incentive would be to refund \$150 if inspections are kept at a minimum.

Mr. Garnett noted that the City has 5-6 acres of buildable land that could be conveyed to a small developer or non-profit. There was a large amount of fees written off but there are still liens on the property. He also suggested working with other taxing entities to see what land is available. He shared a map of some potential properties that could be used.

Assistant City Manager Frank Salvato reported that at another city there was a piece of land that was wanted for park land and the school was owed the majority of the taxes. The City, county and school district worked together, and the school district foreclosed on the land and each entity donated their portion of the land to the city, so it could be used as a park.

Mr. Harrington explained the urban land bank concept noting that cities such as Dallas, Ft. Worth and Irving are currently using land banks. There are very few newly constructed affordable homes or entry level homes in Midland. Staff can work with builders and designers to create new floor plans perhaps by sponsoring a design competition and award prizes. Then a few local builders would be contracted to build and showcase the completed homes. This would reintroduce the traditional entry level home. He noted that these homes typically do not have attached garages noting it costs much more to construct a home with an attached garage.

Council Member Love reported he met with a local builder who will not build in Midland because he felt he was being knit-picked. He suggested investigating to ensure that animosity is not being built up in the City.

Mr. Thorpe introduced the concept of cluster housing with shared common areas. He also shared a product from a Laredo builder who builds homes from 1067 to 1489 square feet for 3 or 4-bedroom homes with no covered parking and no attached garage. The homes start off at \$1,040 a month for the entire payment including taxes and insurance.

Mayor Morales asked what the next steps are to move forward. Mr. Harrington noted that staff will bring some ideas forward to Council for approval. Mayor Morales asked that staff meet with local builders and follow-up to ensure that we are building better relationships.

Chase Gardaphe reported he does manufactured housing and incentives do not apply. He asked if that could be included as well.

The foregoing agenda items were discussed by the City Council with no formal action taken. The Briefing Session was adjourned at 10:03 a.m.

The tank battery is to the north and outside of the City. They are requesting a variance for landscaping. They will have 24-foot sound walls on the north, west and south sides.

Council Member Dufford noted that since there is a water well out there he would like to see it landscaped like the surrounding area with pine trees.

Justin Johns, 500 W. Texas, reported that the disposal well will be inside the City limits but the facilities for the wells are outside of the limits. There will be no commercial truck activity. It takes about 30 days maximum to drill the well. When asked if he had issue with planting pine trees he agreed they would plant trees.
