

**MIDLAND CITY COUNCIL
MINUTES
MAY 11, 2010**

The City Council convened in a Briefing Session in the Basement Conference Room, City Hall, Midland, Texas, at 8:31 a.m. on May 11, 2010.

Brian Allen, 2811 Midkiff, owner of the property, spoke in favor of approval and answered questions.

Mike Curry, owner of 1005 Midkiff, objected to approval of the permit.

There being no one else present wishing to speak, the public hearing was closed at 11:07 a.m.

27. Receive information and provide direction for sunsetting the City Development Advisory Committee.

City Manager Sharp requested direction from the City Council, noting that if the City Development Advisory Committee is sunset, the 1% general fund money cannot be used to fund programs that are currently funded at Midland College and the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce. (Mayor Perry returned to the chamber at 11:23 a.m.)

Following discussion, consensus was received to direct those programs that are currently receiving funding through the general fund, to apply for funding through economic development and to not sunset the City Development Advisory Committee.

28. Interim City Secretary Turner read the caption of Ordinance No. 8801.

Council Member Sparks moved approval of the first of two readings of Ordinance No. 8801 in accordance with the Charter of the City of Midland; seconded by Council Member Trost. The motion carried by the following vote: AYE: Morales, Sparks, Hailey, Trost, James, and Perry. NAY: None. ABSTAIN: None. ABSENT: Dufford. Caption of said ordinance is as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 8801

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE II, "COMMISSIONS AND BOARDS", CHAPTER 8, "MIDLAND CRIME PREVENTION COMMISSION", OF THE CITY CODE OF MIDLAND, TEXAS, BY ESTABLISHING SECTION 5, "SUNSET PROVISION", SO AS TO SUNSET THE MIDLAND CRIME PREVENTION COMMISSION EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 30, 2010; CONTAINING A CUMULATIVE CLAUSE; CONTAINING A SAVINGS AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A MAXIMUM PENALTY OR FINE OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2000.00); AND ORDERING PUBLICATION.

29. Consider an ordinance amending Title VI, "Police Regulations", Chapter 2, "Animals and Fowl", Section 7, "License and Fees, Issuance of Tags, Penalties", Subsection (J) of the Midland City Code, relating to the wearing of valid license tags by animals; and adding a new Section 21, "Penalties, Requirement of Culpability", to Title VI, "Police Regulations", Chapter 2, "Animals and Fowl", of the Midland City Code; containing a cumulative clause and expressly repealing any ordinance or portion thereof in conflict with this ordinance; containing a savings and severability clause; providing for a maximum penalty or fine of five hundred dollars (\$500.00); and ordering publication.

Animal Services Manager O'Neill gave an overview of the item noting that the ordinance would shift the burden of proof to the animal owner to prove that the animal was not currently be transported to a dog show or on a hunting trip.

A motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem James to defer consideration of this item to allow the Animal Services Advisory Commission time to consider this issue and requested the Commission remove the dog show and hunting trip exceptions; seconded by Council Member Trost. The motion carried by the following vote: AYE: Morales, Sparks, Hailey, Trost, James, and Perry. NAY: None. ABSTAIN: None. ABSENT: Dufford.

30. Consideration of appointments to various Boards and Commissions.

Council Member Morales nominated Janet R. Pritchett to another term on the Permian Basin Community Center for Mental Health and Mental Retardation Board; seconded by Council Member Trost. The motion carried by the following vote. AYE: Morales, Sparks, Hailey, Trost, James, and Perry. NAY: None. ABSTAIN: None. ABSENT: Dufford.

31. Mayor Perry announced that the meeting would be recessed to the conference room for lunch.

32. Mayor Perry announced that pursuant to Texas Government Code Section 551.101, the Council would now hold an Executive Session, closed to the public, to discuss the following matters as permitted under the following Texas Government Code Sections:

Section 551.087 Deliberation Regarding Economic Development Negotiations

Discuss business prospects that the City seeks to have locate, stay, or expand in or near the City of Midland, Texas, and discuss possible incentives.

Mayor Perry recessed the meeting to Executive Session at 11:49 a.m.

At 1:43 p.m. Mayor Perry recessed the meeting.

Mayor Perry reconvened the meeting in the Council Chamber at 7:22 p.m., with all Council Members present except for Council Member Dufford, Council Member Morales and Mayor Pro Tem James.

24. Public Hearing on the 2010/2011 Community Development Block Grant Program.

Community Development Manager Cantu gave an overview of the item noting that the five-year plan should be used for establishing funding priorities. He reviewed handouts distributed to the City Council noting that no more than 20 percent can be spent on administration and not more than 15 percent can be spent on public service projects. He reviewed proposals submitted for the following projects: Infrastructure for Sparks Park Housing Development, Owner Occupied Housing Assistance Major Projects, Owner Occupied Housing Assistance – Minor Repairs, Homebuyer Assistance Program, Improvements at Taylor Park and Washington Park, SE Senior Nutrition Program, Local Match Program – Child Care, Home Cleaning Program – Casa de Amigos, Various Park Improvements, Lot Cleaning Program, Demolition Program, CDBG Administration.

Mayor Perry opened the public hearing at 7:37 p.m.

Larry Carroll, Executive Director of Permian Basin Workforce Development, gave a history of the center, noting that the state has changed their matching grant requirements and requested that the City Council fund \$75,000.

Lance Friday, 4228 Timberglen Place, requested the City Council fund the paving of 1100-1300 block of Dormard.

Luis Sanchez, 1215 S. Dallas, requested that focus be put on paving unpaved streets.

Max Cuellar Jr., 400 E. Longview, requested money be used to widen the streets in the windowpane area.

Max Reyes, 2301 W. Elizabeth, requested funding for park improvements at Taylor Park and Washington Park.

There being no one else present wishing to speak, the public hearing was closed at 8:09 p.m.

All of the business at hand having been completed, the meeting adjourned at 8:09 p.m.
