Strategies:

- **2.1 Be the safest city in West Texas:** Enhance public safety programs.
- **2.2 Improve pedestrian and motorist safety:** Invest in traffic management and infrastructure.

Midland Police Department

Safe Passage Initiative

- **Operation Intersection-DATES**
 - 2,267 traffic stops
 - 1,388 citations.
 - 54 arrests.
 - 1 vehicle pursuit.
- **Operation Cruise Control-DATES ongoing**
 - 723 traffic stops
 - 333 citations
 - 20+ arrests
- **Decreased Collisions**
- **Decreased in non-traffic related crimes in focused area**





CRIME DROPS



IN MIDLAND

- Homicide -28.57%
- Robbery -25%
- Assault -12.64%
- Burglary -16.71%
- Larceny/Theft -6.51%
- Motor Vehicle Theft -18.93%
- Total Part 1 crimes -10.43%*

Fire Department

- **IPAWS (Integrated Public Alert & Warning System)**
 - Testing on-going
 - Public Information campaign at system launch
- **21,776 Incidents (3.6% increase)**
 - County – 4,036 incidents (18.53%)
 - EMS
 - 16,413 Incidents (2,971 County – 18.1%)
 - 19,270 Patients
 - 12,130 Transports



GOAL TWO SAFE AND SECURE CITY

Midland Fire Department


- PPE risk assessment and wear test completed 8/24
 - InnoTex was selected as the department's PPE provider, offering the best combination of performance and price
 - \$20,000 annual savings
 - National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Standard 1851 requirement



GOAL TWO SAFE AND SECURE CITY

Animal Services

- **Animal Intakes:** 5,599 animals in 2024, 19% increase from 2023.
- **Return-to-Owner Rate:** Improved to 11.58% from 10.95% in 2023, despite higher intakes.
- **Adoptions & Rescues:** 1,342 adoptions; 824 dogs rescued; 70.55% live release rate.
- **Expanded Services:** Launched Pet Pantry and Foster Program to support pet owners and improve outcomes.
- **Animal Control:** Responded to 6,220 calls, enhancing community and animal safety.

- Currently providing HQHVSN (High-Quality High-Volume Spay/Neuter) services for shelters and rescues in Houston.



GOAL TWO SAFE AND SECURE CITY

Midland Health Department

- **7,481 patients seen for immunization**
- **973 Health Inspections** completed
- **16 vaccine clinics**
 - Held at the Health Department and off-site
- **389 Texas notifiable condition investigations**



GOAL TWO SAFE AND SECURE CITY

Code Enforcement

- **Focus on Case Volume:**
 - Monthly caseload **quadrupled** since April, from 280 average monthly cases to more than 1,100 cases
 - Added **3 new** officers, emphasis on **proactive** patrolling, focused on **efficiency** to keep officers in the field longer
- **Focus on Efficient Enforcement:**
 - Despite higher case volumes, **closure rates improved to 90%** (up from 87%)
 - Closure **efficiency improved** across case types; since May, **86%** of closed cases closed within 30 days (up from 81%)

GOAL TWO SAFE AND SECURE CITY

Code Enforcement

Focus on Process Improvements:

- Board and secure process for vacant, dangerous buildings streamlined via ordinance;
 - **Result:** Vaughn Building successfully + efficiently secured; costs recovered from owner and process is replicable
- Abatement process for weeds + junked lots streamlined via administrative change;
 - **Result:** Several severely junked lots are now cleared within 30 days
